

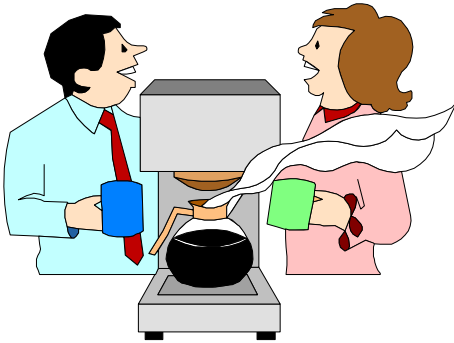

Due to the small number meeting in a cold Church, the evening congregation decided that through winter we shall join with other Churches in the area, unless there is something special on at Christ Church. So, on 29th January & 11th February we shall join with St Mary's Nunthorpe for Evensong at 5.30pm. During Lent we shall join the Deanery Lent Services at Stokesley Parish Church at 6pm. A Mixed Year

Well, the figures are done for another year as we send our annual statistics into the centre so someone can prophesy the life or death of the Church of England. What will they see from ours?

First of all, the lack of snow this Christmas did wonders for attendance with 585 attending worship at Christ Church on Christmas Eve/ Day and 82 at St Oswald's . This was on top of full Churches for all our Christmas Carol Services. Well up on last year.

Easter attendance down slightly to 262 at Christ Church and 25 at Newton, not helped by an extremely late Easter which gave good opportunity for an early and cheaper holiday that was taken by many.

Average Sunday adult attendance fell at Great Ayton to 130 from 146 per week, which is not surprising given the number of the Congregation who died during 2011. I counted 11 formerly regular worshippers whose funerals I took in 2011, although some had stopped a few years earlier due to illness. The actual number of people who come is far larger, for people have different patterns of attendance.

But there is good news there too, for the Come and Praise Service at Christ Church is being revitalised by some of the Little Fishes weekday group joining it. We are also seeing very good attendances at the All Age Service at St Oswald's with over 40 present in both December and January.

Baptisms at Christ Church were 26, which is less than normal but may reflect fewer babies being born. Six baptisms took place at St Oswald's with former wedding couples returning and members of the All Age Service bringing their children for baptism.

Weddings were down in 2011 with only 6 at Christ Church at 2 at St Oswald's Church, but this trend has already been turned by attending wedding fayres and promoting Church weddings. We now have 20 booked in for 2012 and 5 already for 2013.

You don't go looking for Funerals, and the problem with being in a Parish so long is that you know so many people. Amongst the 51 funerals taken last year, there were many people I mourn the loss of too. We have been losing some of the most faithful and dedicated members of Christ Church. When I am in Church I still see my former flock in my mind's eye, and believe me, this congregation is certainly growing. The large number of funerals last year may reflect a higher death rate in

our village, but it may also say that people find our Church the right place to be to mark such occasions. We certainly try to give our best and make every service a positive occasion.

So we have a mixture of good news to celebrate and other news to warn us that we cannot take anything for granted. We have set ourselves a target to try and raise the number of regular Sunday worshippers by 5% during this year - somebody please tell the weather!

As part of our strategy we shall be looking again at our Mission Action Plan. This was an idea brought in by Archbishop David Hope that Bishop Martin is continuing, and we have found it a useful tool in the life of our Church. Recently, through the PCC, the MAP was revised and we shall be telling the congregation more about it and listening to their thoughts, on Sunday 11th March at all our Morning Services, so come along and join us.

“Great Ayton Central”

Last year the County Council decided that several branch libraries had to close in order to meet budgetary cuts, and unfortunately amongst them was Great Ayton Library. Although well used by its community, alternative facilities were thought to be near enough at the recently built Library at Stokesley.



Following huge protests and the biggest crowd ever seen at a Meeting at the Parochial Hall, residents began the task of working to save the Library and develop its facilities.

At a series of recent meetings in the Library itself, Ian Pearce explained that funding to save facilities had been forthcoming through £30,000 each from the Parish Precept and the County Council, with a further £5,000 needed to be raised locally, and a business plan had been drawn up for this, together with a large list of volunteers.

The Library would close on 31st March and re-open on 12th May with a volunteer workforce and an RFID Terminal to log books in and out with. Support would still be given through trained staff, although we don't know who they will be yet. It is hoped that extra facilities will be available through making more use of the building, and opening hours may also be extended.

Suggestions for a new name would be welcome, but the working name in the meantime is **Great Ayton Central**. The new venture will be a charity run by Trustees. Well done to all who have worked hard to save this important village facility.

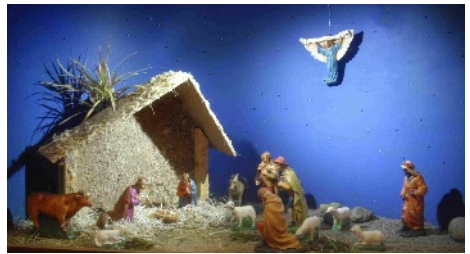
The Memory Tree gave a focal point for prayer for departed loved ones with 100

Chris Preston - A Tribute



If you have attended Sunday worship at Christ Church in the last 33 years, you can't have missed Chris Preston who has been faithful and regular in the choir every Sunday since joining in 1978. When Elsie Readman died shortly after my arrival in 1993, Chris took up pole position on the organ side of the Chancel, a position she filled extremely well, for Chris was a big lady with a big smile, and her enjoyment of what she was doing was plain for all to see.

As well as up front with the choir, Chris organised all the robes, the music, the choir fund and kept things running smoothly behind the scenes.

She has also been a Cub Leader in Great Ayton and was called Hathi, after the elephant in *Jungle Book*, when her three lads were in the Cubs and Scouts and had served for a time as Assistant District Commissioner (Cubs) at District level.

Over recent years Chris had also become a School Governor at Roseberry Primary School and had been going in there regularly since retiring to help out in the classrooms.

When we heard of Chris' very sudden, unexpected and very peaceful death just before Christmas, we were all taken very much by surprise, for here was a lady you thought would go on for years to come. She never complained about her health and never felt the cold. When everyone else was wrapping up warm, Chris was walking about in short sleeves and sandals.



Chris had been very active right to the end. The week before she died she had sung at all our Carol Services both at St Oswald's, Newton and Christ Church. She passed away peacefully in her sleep.

Christ Church was full for her Funeral Service, where the choir sang *Ave Verum Corpus* for her, and then processed out to *Colonel Hathi's March* from the Disney version of *Jungle Book*, bringing a smile to all present, which Chris would have loved. Our thoughts and prayers go to husband Jack, and sons Ken, Floyd and Robert and all their families.

Talking to our village undertaker, Michael Rea of *Ayton & District Funeral Services* recently, he told me that Golden Charter Funeral Plans are increasing the basic cost of a plan by £300 on 1st April 2012. What's Happening at Stokesley School?

Happy New Year! We have lots of good news as the Stokesley School Church Youth Workers project and we see a bright future as we have increased opportunities for the Gospel message to be heard.

Firstly we have a new arrival to the team. Jaime Smyth has come to us as a gap year volunteer from Tennessee. She is a 23 year old graduate and is a gifted musician and singer. She has her own CD released in the United States so is a local celebrity out there. She will be a much needed boost to reach the girls in our project in school and has a heart to get alongside them and introduce and grow them in faith. We have her already building relationships and adding a new aspect to what we can offer to the young people we meet.



Secondly we are excited by the opportunity to launch a new addition to our work. As a wider strategy, Youth For Christ have been working alongside local Coffee shops to provide Café Church as a mission opportunity and a bridge to the local church. Young people are invited to hear a message relevant to them with music and discussion times. We are incredibly excited that the new Costa Coffee in Stokesley has been receptive enough to allow us to meet there once a month to launch a “Stokesley Café Church” meeting. This will hopefully become a monthly gathering and starts from 7pm Tuesday 7th March.

In addition to our SI youth events we run at the school youth centre each month, Our aim is to provide a bridge to the local church, it's an ecumenical youth meeting with a difference. Our prayer is that local church youth groups and those in school who now want to consider taking faith further will come together and then in time become part of the wider Christian community as they are challenged to take faith seriously. There is a real pull when young people can see other Christian young people and then feel they can invite their friends to hear more.

Thirdly! In March we have the return of our mission team from Texas. We are actively planning a fun and faith packed overnight stay at Sneaton Castle in Whitby. This residential will be a chance for young people to experience faith, build friendships and enjoy each others company for an evening and day of different workshops and meetings.
