If you come to either Church and see a young wedding couple sat near you, please do your part by speaking to them and making them feel at home. It is now their Church too.

As part of their fourteenth annual UK charity tour, the Osiligi Maasai warriors will be performing in concert at St Magdalene Church Yarm on Sunday 18th September at 4pm

The troupe,(five men and two ladies), are **stunning** performers, and thrill every audience between the ages of 5-95 Certainly every venue has found their performance an experience never to be forgotten. We have performed in countless venue , including the Cathedrals of Exeter, Salisbury, Peterborough and Ely (4 times) theatres, schools and universities.

The tours have created a wonderful story. They, and the charity which stemmed from them, have taken the Troupe and their community, some 30 miles Southwest of Nairobi, from the total poverty, they used to endure in 2002. They now have corrugated iron houses, instead of mud huts, in which to live, fresh clean water at three points in their community, solar lamps instead of kerosene, a new church, and, most wonderfully, a new village school. Last year saw the completion of a new clinic, and this year the new orphanage will open.






